## CALL FOR PRESENTERS: “Interprofessional Village” Table Hosts

Wisconsin AHEC invites you to join us in hosting an interprofessional learning fair for college students from across the state, who are competing in the 2018 Interprofessional Healthcare Case Competition.

### What is the Interprofessional Village?

- A resource fair with a station for each health profession at its own table, the “Interprofessional Village” is an opportunity for college students to explore roles & responsibilities, values & ethics, and teamwork, through the perspectives of different health care professionals.
- Students will be issued an “IP Passport” to travel among the various stations within the IP village. At each station, students will engage in a brief discussion/activity with the table host and complete the passport.

### Who is eligible to host a table?

- Healthcare professionals in Wisconsin, including but not limited to: nursing, pharmacy, medicine, social work, dentistry, dietetics, radiology, public health, athletic training, environmental health, physical therapy, occupational therapy, lab/research science, hospital/clinic administration, and more!

### When and where is the IP Village?

- The IP Village will run concurrently with the team presentations during the case competition, in an adjoining ballroom. Table hosts may attend morning, afternoon, or both sessions of the IP Village.

### What’s the Interprofessional Healthcare Case Competition?

Wisconsin AHEC has invited students from all Wisconsin colleges/universities to compete in a case competition event during the Fall 2017 semester, culminating in a special event held in the Wisconsin Dells (January 11-12, 2018).

- Health professions students from any degree or discipline may compete, on a team of 4-5 students, with at least three different degrees/professions represented.
- Teams will work together Oct.-Dec.
- Each team will conduct an analysis of interprofessional efforts during the care of a patient/client (case study provided to team).
- At the end, top teams are invited to present their findings to a panel of judges representing various disciplines in the community of Wisconsin’s healthcare professionals.
- Teams will travel to Wisconsin Dells to present their case January 11-12, 2018.
- Cash prizes are awarded to winning teams.
