

CHIP APPLICATION CERTIFICATION

If accepted into CHIP you are expected to work your intern position for the hours required (full-time, three-quarters-time, half-time, quarter-time) throughout the 8-week program. CHIP runs

from June 3 - July 26, 2024 and includes a mandatory orientation. Any time taken off during the program MUST receive prior approval from both your Host Site Mentor and the Wisconsin AHEC CHIP Coordinator. Time missed must be made up. We understand that you may not know your summer schedule at the present time and events may come up unexpectedly. However, if you are offered a CHIP internship placement we expect that you will do your best to make arrangements throughout the summer around the internship schedule, making your commitment to the internship and your host site a priority.
